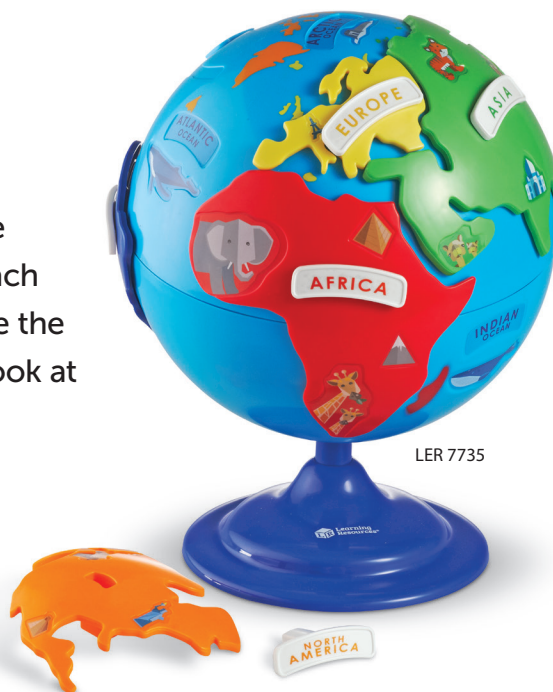


Puzzle Globe

1. A is for Asia (Letter practice)

Look at the names of the continents below. Do you see anything interesting about the first and last letters in each name? Try writing the names on a piece of paper. Circle the first and last letter in each name. They are the same! Look at how many names begin and end with the letter A!

2. It's a Big World! Which continent is the largest? Which is the smallest? Can you say the names of the seven continents in order from largest to smallest?

Answer: Asia, Africa, North America, South America, Antarctica, Europe, Australia.

You might be surprised to learn that Antarctica is not the smallest continent, but it has the fewest number of people. Do you know why? Because it's extremely cold!

3. Water, Water Everywhere! Look at your puzzle globe. What colour do you see the most of? The blue on the globe represents water. Over 70% of Earth's surface is water—that's why you see so much blue! Can you name some things that live in the ocean? Here are a few; how many more can you name? Whales, fish, dolphins, crabs, oysters...keep going!
